
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DREAM DESTINATIONS!



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The summer is a fabulous time to explore Ladakhi wildlife. One of our favourite sights is of Himalayan brown bears that can be seen frolicking along the mountain slopes. These bears are omnivorous and playful, as long as you don't infringe on their territory. While brown bears are generally not an endangered species, this particular subspecies found in the Himalayas, is critically endangered according to IUCN. Some of the best sightings take place in the rugged wilderness in western Ladakh. The summer brings out a variety of other animals as well such as the red fox, the ibex, the urial and the Tibetan hare. While the accommodations are rustic and charming, the Ladakhi hospitality is warm and welcoming. The local trackers are excellent and know where the bears can be found. Brown bears are extremely photogenic, and if you're a wildlife photographer, this is a trip worth taking. Ask us today to learn more about brown bear safaris and summer wildlife in Ladakh!

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Several mountain animals can only be observed in their natural habitat at specific times of the year. Here's our calendar of seasonal sightings.

JUNE - NOVEMBER: Brown Bears

Brown bears emerge from their winter hibernation once the snow melts in June. You can find them on the steep mountain slopes in the south and west of Ladakh.

DECEMBER - FEBRUARY: Snow Leopards

Once the winter snowfall covers the higher reaches of the Trans- Himalayan region, the Snow Leopards come down to lower altitudes. Hemis National Park is one of the best places to see this magnificent feline.

LATE OCTOBER - MARCH: Black Necked Crane

Every winter, the black-necked crane descend from the Tibetan plateau and comes to roost in the Phobjikha valley in Bhutan. The arrival of the birds is marked by a vibrant festival, as the Bhutanese consider this bird to be sacred.

Rajaji National Park is one of the best-kept secrets in the Himalayas. This rugged terrain is home to over five hundred wild elephants, making it one of the highest densities of elephants per square kilometre. The park is also home to tigers as well as several leopards, and the sightings for feline enthusiasts are good. You can also find Himalayan black bears and sloth bears, as well as the rare Goral.

This park is home to over 400 species of birds, making it a must for birdlovers. The river rushing through it attracts a variety of wildlife and makes the landscape very scenic. One of our favourite places to stay is the Aalia Jungle Bandarjudh.

Enjoy daily jeep game drives into the forest with excellent naturalists and drivers. You can also go to Haridwar and Rishikesh, which are just a short drive away from the park. Ask us today to discover how you can include Rajaji in your itinerary.

THE TERAL ARC INDIA

The Terai Arc Biosphere is one of a kind. A vast swathe of grassland, interspersed with dense forest, it is home to tigers, elephants, leopards, Gharial, rhinos and several other species. On the Indian side of the border, Dudhwa, Pilibhit and Katerniaghat are sister forests that are full of incredible wildlife. We suggest basing yourself in Dudhwa and exploring the other two sanctuaries on full day excursions. Pristine nature and truly wild, this is a terrific experience for any true wildlife lover.

THE TERAL ARC NEPAL

On the Nepalese side, Chitwan and Bardiya both fall within the Terai Arc. Nepal has lead a highly successful conservation exercise to multiply the tiger, rhino and elephant population in these parks. The one-horned Indian rhino is a major highlight, as are herds of wild elephants, and tigers that slink through the tall grass. This region is also home to the Tharu tribe, who are known for their incredible bond with elephants. Visit local Tharu settlements and learn more about these incredible folk.

RAFTING ON THE TRISULI RIVER



TREKKING THROUGH LANDRUK

Pass through local villages where you can engage with the local Gurung folk and learn about their earthy culture and spirituality.
